



## **:APPRAISAL:**

This appraisal is written about one Navajo rug/textile witnessed by me on this date of March 20, 2007 and is currently part of the W & V Miller estate of Baytown, Texas.

The textile/rug is hand-woven in the traditional style of the Dine {Navajo} Nation Native Americans of the Southwest.

### **:Detailed Rug/Textile Description:**

This textile/rug measures approximately 59.5" x 40" overall.

The textile/rug features a variation of a design commonly known as a "Two Grey Hills". The Two Grey pattern is well known to the indigenous, Native American weavers of the Southwestern United States and is often replicated and/or altered by them.

This two grey hills textile contains the classic symbol of a central jagged edged diamond design accented with a variation of the "Greek Key" edge bezel.

There are 6 colors used in the creation of this textile, they are as follows: bone white, light tan, dark brown, black, light grey and a darker grey.

The wefts per inch for this textile are approximately 70 to 80 on average thus creating a very tightly woven textile with excellent design detail.

Attached to the rug is a tag indicating the actual maker of this textile. The artists name is Zonnee Jones, a 4/4 member of the Navajo nation, Arizona.

Styling and weave type of the textile/rug is indicative of 1980's to present.

The rug is in excellent – like new condition.

**The current "fair market value" of this Navajo ~ Two Grey Hills design rug/textile as of this date as determined by this appraiser is \$5500.00**
